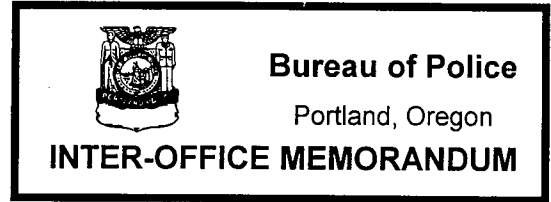

DATE AND TIME OCCURRED: January 29, 2010 / 1819 hours

LOCATION OF OCCURRENCE: 12800 NE Sandy Blvd. #37

OFFICERS INVOLVED: See Below Listed Personnel

NARRATIVE:

On January 29, 2010 at 1819 hours, North Precinct activated SERT to approach a subject who was shot by police and was now down in front of a vehicle. The subject was reported to be suicidal and believed to be armed. Because of the subject's location, uniform officers were unable to approach the subject safely. While en route to the location, North Precinct Captain Day (the on scene Commander), came up on the SERT radio net and gave SERT the mission to approach the downed subject as soon as possible. While still enroute I broadcast for the first five SERT Officers that arrive with access to a shield, to go forward and approach the subject if safe to do so. As it turned out, I was the fifth SERT Operator to arrive. I observed that the SERT armored BEAR truck had also arrived. I immediately boarded the BEAR truck with four SERT Operators and one SERT Fire Medic and drove to the downed subject's location. Using a ballistic shield, I and the four Operators approached the downed subject. I could see that the downed subject had his right hand underneath his body out of view in the waistband area. I gave verbal commands to the subject to bring his hand into view. There was no response from the subject. With the protection of the shield team I approached the subject and pulled his hand out from underneath his body. I instructed SERT Officer J. Harris to handcuff the downed subject and I frisked the subject for weapons. I then ordered the SERT Medic forward to check the welfare of the subject. After examination, Medic Bregman determined that the subject was deceased. I informed Command and was given the mission to clear apartment #37 for any additional persons. I ordered two additional SERT Operators to my location and sent the clear team inside. No additional persons were found inside.

Upon clearing apartment #37, a citizen emerged from out of the apartment complex and attempted to run inside apartment #37. The subject was stopped by SERT Officers and escorted out of the crime scene, where he was handed off to Uniform. The crime scene was then secured by the SERT Operators until relieved by Uniform Officers.

CONCLUSION:

This incident required immediate action and the main mission for this incident was approved prior to SERT arrival. The SERT Operators involved responded quickly and safely. The SERT armored BEAR truck had been driven to the scene by TOD Officer Hubert and SERT continued to utilize Hubert for the mission.

The below listed overtime rate reflects a full team SERT activation. The first six SERT Officers listed on the PERSONNEL table below were the only SERT Officers utilized to perform missions during this activation; the remaining personnel arrived on scene after deployment of the mission team, or were canceled en route.
